2) Over Parish Council would like to express deep concern about possible under-provision of parking spaces in Northstowe Phase 3B in an attempt to meet the target development density which will also impact on Phase 3A

- 7.1 Borrowing Approval needed for an application for a Public Works Loan for improvement work at Overcote of between £33,000 to a possible £50,000 – Cllrs Tranter and Couper had prepared documents that had been sent to Council prior to the meeting to aid discussion. Cllr Tranter gave a brief overview of his paper for consideration noting that vehicle movements had caused some damage that would need to be rectified and contractor payments could be staggered to facilitate cashflow. Cllr Twiss asked the Council to note that not all damage can be identified while the area remains in flood. Work would need to be held off until the flood waters have subsided, and the earth has had a chance to dry out. It is only then that all problems can be looked at in detail and assessed.
RESOLVED: It was proposed, seconded, and unanimously approved that this item could be tabled again for discussion in April. In the meantime, Cllr Tranter can contact the project Contractor to book in the work already identified and precepted for in the next financial year. **ACTION CLERK & AT**

COVID-19 Vaccination update

The vaccination programme is now well underway. In our local area an incredible 15 Primary Care Sites have been opened and two additional Hospital Hubs over the last 2-3 weeks alone, which now gives us full area coverage.

The rollout of the vaccination programme in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough is on track to offer vaccinations to the top four priority cohorts by the middle of February. Thousands of vulnerable local people have already received their first vaccination, with thousands more being vaccinated every day. Recent national news reports of the expansion of the vaccination programme to people in their 70s or who are clinically extremely vulnerable, is good news as it means they can start to vaccinate these other priority groups once they have offered the vaccination to the priority groups first. Cambridgeshire and Peterborough CCG continue to reassure people in the top two priority groups - care home residents and staff, those aged 80 and over, and frontline healthcare workers - that they are still being prioritised for vaccinations.

A new vaccination Centre has now opened at the Grafton Centre in Cambridge. Further locations will go live over the coming days and weeks. Some local residents may also receive invitations to book appointments at national vaccination centers, such as Stevenage, but this is just another option. If they can't travel or they would rather wait for an appointment closer to home, they can choose to do that, and their local GP-led service will be in touch soon to offer an alternative. The national ambition, if supplies allow, is to have offered vaccines to the most vulnerable 13 million people by the middle of February, and are on target to offer vaccinations to our local residents who fall into these groups. The NHS locally has the capacity and trained staff to deliver vaccines as soon as they have been manufactured and have undergone the relevant safety checks.

Covid-19 Hubs and Libraries helping distribute emergency hygiene packs

Residents struggling whether to afford either food or toiletries are able to contact their local hub to access emergency hygiene packs. Helped by sixteen libraries across Cambridgeshire, the Hubs have distributed over 250 toiletry packs to those needing emergency supplies. The pack includes soap, toothpaste, laundry and cleaning products and sanitary supplies. The County Hub noticed early in December 2020 that quite a lot of requests were coming in to support with hygiene supplies. Families who were low on money were having to choose between food or toiletries. They worked with the library services in each district and provided them with a supply and when they get a request through to the Hub for support, they will direct them to their nearest library to pick up a pack.

Rapid testing for Key Workers

A Rapid Testing for key workers and all those who cannot work from home pilot is set to launch across Cambridgeshire to help track cases of Coronavirus and drive down transmission rates. A number of sites are being set up across the county offering rapid tests to people aged 18 and over who have no symptoms of Coronavirus. Cambridgeshire County Council has 100,000 tests kits to be used in the next six weeks, with the potential for the pilot to be extended.

Around one in three people who are infected with Covid-19 have no symptoms and could be spreading the disease without knowing it. Broadening testing to identify key workers showing no symptoms will mean finding positive cases more quickly, which helps break chains of transmission. Initially there will be six sites across the county, with the potential to set up pop-up sites in areas of high need if required. Tests will be offered at no cost to the public. By testing these people on a regular basis - twice a week for at least six weeks - can reduce the number of cases of Covid-19 across Cambridgeshire, limit the number of people who might die or become very ill as a result of the virus. Lateral flow tests are a new kind of technology that can be used to test a higher proportion of asymptomatic people and do not require a laboratory to process the test.

- Soham Town Rangers Football Club, Julius Martin Lane, Soham, Ely, East Cambridgeshire, CB7 5EQ – launches Friday 5 February.
- Huntingdon, The Coneygear Centre, Butts Grove Way, Huntingdon, PE29 1PE – launches Thursday 11 February.
- Cambridge, The Meadows Community Centre, 1 St Catherine's Rd, Arbury, Cambridge, CB4 3XJ – launches Friday 12 February.

Winter grants scheme helps over 32,000 children and young people

Households and individuals across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough facing challenges because of the pandemic have received help from their local authority. More than 32,000 children and young people received support either individually or through their families as part of Cambridgeshire County Council's winter grants scheme. The winter grants scheme supports families and individuals experiencing immediate financial hardship with access to food and essential supplies over the Christmas period and beyond.

This support is being offered in two ways – as a direct food voucher scheme or as extra support for vulnerable families and individuals.

- 306 households have been supported with emergency food
- 578 emergency fuel vouchers have been issued
- 133 families have been able to go to their local library to collect personal hygiene products
- 9 replacement household appliances have been provided for emergency situations or medical reasons

This is in addition to nearly 65,000 supermarket vouchers handed out to eligible families and children struggling in the run-up to Christmas, and the same families will automatically receive further vouchers in the February half term. Also, resolving requests for other help and support from around 2,500 households (including help with household heating and water bills, food and other essential supplies).

District Councillor Report to Over Parish Council February 2021

Doubling Nature

SCDC has just announced a high-level strategy for 'Doubling Nature' in South Cambridgeshire, setting out an approach to increasing wildlife-rich habitats tree canopies and improving access to green spaces. The Strategy will see the Council working with communities and businesses to protect and enhance the district's natural capital, as well as taking action on its own estate. The aims are to:

- give nature space and help to reverse declines in habitat and species
- provide more areas for people to enjoy nature and benefit their health & wellbeing
- improve the quality of air
- help to manage water for nature
- create more resilience to climate change, and
- boost the economy of the district.

While it directly controls only a tiny area of land in the district, the Council aspires to be as an exemplar to others through nature enhancing measures such as tree planting and reseeding suitable green spaces with wildflowers. The Council will make the most of its influence as the local planning authority to achieve 20% biodiversity net gain on all developments in the district and ensure that nature is not just protected but significantly enhanced, especially important since South Cambridgeshire is one of the fastest growing areas in the country. The strategy also sets out how the Council will support and encourage residents and communities to do more for nature including through grants programmes and support for volunteer Tree Wardens.

Flooding

Since the end of December, we have endured one of the wettest periods in 150 years, and this has tested the drainage infrastructure to the limit and beyond. Also sorely tested has been the ability of the water utility and drainage authorities to cope with the numerous emergencies across the district. Bill has raised the issue of blocked road gullies (such as that in West Street) with the County Council and will report back when he gets answers.

Climate and Environment Fortnight

Commencing on Monday 22 February, SCDC are marking Climate and Environment Fortnight 2021 with a series of webinars to help people think about how to live more sustainably, reduce carbon emissions and in turn help tackle climate change. All are welcome to join any of these free online events.

Guidance for managing playgrounds and outdoor gyms

MHCLG has recently updated the guidance for owners and operators of playgrounds and outdoor gyms in England to enable their use during the national lockdown. During the lockdown, playgrounds are primarily open for use by children who do not have access to private outdoor space, like their own garden. Although parents, guardians or carers can take children to a playground for exercise, they must not socialise with other people while there.

East-West Rail Cambourne to Cambridge Northern route

You may be aware that a campaign group - CamBedRailRoad - is campaigning to deliver a route alignment for the East-West Rail section from Cambourne to Cambridge North via a new station at Northstowe.

Their suggested final stage of the route runs from Cambourne northwards passing to the south of Dry Drayton, across the A14 and then parallel with Dry Drayton Road to the south of Oakington where the new Northstowe station would be located. It then runs to the south of Landbeach/north of Milton to join the London/Kings Lynn line at Cambridge North Station. The chair of the group has offered to attend parish council meetings to explain their route and the case for it and to listen to councillors' views. If you wish to hear such a talk, let Bill know.

Self-isolation support: Direct mail to residents

SCDC will be sending out a Coronavirus-related direct mail to all households in South Cambridgeshire in the next couple of weeks. This will contain an A4 flyer, produced by the Council, that details the financial and practical support available to people who need to self-isolate. This is to help ensure that residents feel there is enough local assistance available to assist them to comply with critical self-isolation. The envelope will also include a flyer produced by the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough CCG that provides helpful information about the vaccine roll-out locally. These will be sent to all residents during the weeks commencing 8 and 15 February.

'Stand Firm' campaign

In an effort to counter complacency about Covid and false information (that the pandemic is a hoax, or overblown) 'Stand Firm' is a new multi-media campaign for Cambridgeshire and Peterborough, which focuses on the personal testimonies of local people who have been impacted on by Covid-19. These stories work on the premise that by making the virus and impacts tangible and local, you make the threat real and inspire others to follow the rules by use of the narrative 'stand firm'. The delivery will involve a range of approaches and partners, including parish councils; you should receive something about this soon.

Resources for raising awareness about vaccine fraud

Criminals are using the coronavirus vaccine as a way to target the public by tricking them to hand over cash or financial details. They are sending convincing-looking text messages telling people they are eligible for the vaccine or are phoning people directly pretending to be from the NHS or their local pharmacy. The Government has developed resources, including posters and guides, to help councils with their work to communicate to groups and networks the importance of staying alert to vaccine fraud.
